

Be Informed When You Vote -

2008 Bernalillo County Bond Issues - Six important questions will appear on the General Election Ballot to fund community improvement projects. There is no tax increase associated with these Bond Issues.

COUNTY BOND ISSUE #1

Library Books and Materials

\$1,000,000 to keep our Albuquerque/Bernalillo County Library system up to date - all library branches will benefit.

COUNTY BOND ISSUE #2

Public Safety -\$4,750,000 to be used for public safety projects:

CO-LOCATED SHERIFF & FIRE EMERGENCY CENTER

\$1,500,000 to construct and equip a co-located Sheriff and Fire Emergency Center in the East Mountains.

TRAINING ACADEMY -

\$1,900,000 to plan, design and construct a Public Safety Training Academy.

FIRE FACILITIES

\$1,350,000 to plan, design, construct and equip a new fire facility and upgrade existing facilities that will include ADA compliance standards.

COUNTY BOND ISSUE #3

Parks and Recreation Facilities - \$2,500,000 for development of parks and improvement to recreational facilities.

RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

\$1,275,000 to redevelop and improve parks, playgrounds and pools and Raymond G. Sanchez and Paradise Hills Community Centers.

AMBASSADOR EDWARD L. ROMERO PARK, PHASE II

\$475,000 for construction including landscaping, trails, playground and equipment.

SOUTH VALLEY GATEWAY PARK

\$750,000 to design, construct and purchase equipment for the park.

COUNTY BOND ISSUE #4 -Family Health Facilities

\$2,000,000 to plan, design, construct and/or purchase existing facility for a public family health facility.

COUNTY BOND ISSUE #5 - Road Construction and Improvements

\$7,000,000 for improvements to roads and non-motor vehicle pathways within Bernalillo County.

EUBANK BOULEVARD -

\$2,500,000 to expand road to four lanes that will include traffic signals.

ASPHALT PAVING -

\$1,500,000 to pave unincorporated area roadways.

LYON AND UNSER BOULEVARD -

\$500,000 to construct two additional turn lanes, bike lanes and sidewalks.

ARENAL ROAD IMPROVEMENTS -

\$500,000 to install safety and pedestrian improvements and reconstruct approach to Coors and Tapia.

SAGE ROAD SW -

\$300,000 to expand segments of road to four lanes from Coors west to municipal limits.

TRAFFIC CALMING -

\$300,000 to install traffic calming devices throughout the unincorporated area.

ROADWAY STRIPING AND PAVEMENT MARKING -

\$300,000 for striping and marking county maintained roads.

BLAKE ROAD -

\$250,000 to reconstruct road southwest from Coors to the city limits.

ALAMEDA BOULEVARD -

\$250,000 to reconstruct and acquire right of way from Barstow to Eubank and south to Paseo del Norte.

STATE SCHOOL BUS ROUTE PROGRAM -

\$161,000 to match NMDOT grants for improvements to various school and bus routes including paving, drainage and safety.

STATE COOPERATIVE PROGRAM -

\$110,000 to match NMDOT grants for road paving, drainage and safety.

COUNTY ARTERIAL PROGRAM -

\$129,000 to match NMDOT grants for arterial road paving, drainage and safety.

GUARDRAILS -

\$100,000 to install, repair and upgrade guardrails on County maintained roads.

118TH STREET EXTENSION TO I-40-

\$100,000 to prepare a location corridor study to plan and design project from Eucariz to future I-40 exchange.

COUNTY BOND ISSUE #6 - South Valley Flood Reduction

\$3,500,000 to place flood reduction infrastructure in the southwest valley including reconstructing the Isleta, Armijo and Los Padillas drains north and south of Rio Bravo Boulevard.
